


Rotate the piece 90 degrees so that Area 4 is oriented as shown in the diagrams. Using the wash-away pen, make a mark every 4" along the bottom of the block. Make a mark 2" from the top left edge of the block and then 2 more marks 4" apart.
- 2



Mark a horizontal line in the center of the block. Make a mark 2" from the left edge of this line and then 2 more marks 4" apart.
- 3



Starting in the bottom left hand corner of the area, connect the marks on the bottom of the mark with the marks on the top of the block.

Without ending your thread, connect the marks on the bottom of the mark with the marks on the horizontal line in the center of the block.



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


Using a wash-away pen, mark a vertical line in the center of Area 5. Starting from the center out, make a mark every 2" along the top and bottom of the area.


Starting from the center, connect the mark at the top of the area with the next mark at the bottom of the area. Continue to the next mark at the top of the area.


Continue to the right edge of the area. Note that you might have to just approximate the last motif.




Stitch a little way down the edge of the area if needed to mirror the motif and work your way back toward the left connecting the marks that you skipped.
 - 5



Continue on past the center to the left edge of the area. Note that you might have to just approximate the last motif.
 - 6



Work your way back to center connecting the marks that you skipped.

Using a wash-away pen, make a mark 2-1/2" from the left edge of the area along its top and bottom edge. Make marks 4" to the right and left of these marks.

Select the ruler that quilts a circle 4" in diameter. Tape together a few nested rulers if desired to give yourself more surface area. Connect the two marks on the top of the area, taking care to align the quadrant markings on the ruler with the quilting line on the top of the area to ensure that you are quilting a perfect semi-circle.

Move the ruler and continue on to create a partial motif.

Quilt up the edge of the area and create a mirror image of what you just quilted. Continue on to finish the bottom row.


Quilt a little down the edge of the area and complete the motif by quilting a mirror image back to your starting point.

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


Using a wash-away pen, make horizontal line across the middle of the area.
- 2




Select the ruler that quilts a circle 1" in diameter. *(You'll be quilting around the inside of a circle whose opening is 1-1/2".)* Tape together a few nested rulers if desired to give yourself more surface area. Starting on the left edge of the area and aligning quadrant markings on the ruler with the marked line you made in step 1, quilt a clockwise circle.

Continue to quilt on top of your previous stitches until you get to the right side of the circle.
- 4



Move the ruler and quilt another circle, stitching in a counter-clockwise direction. Continue to quilt on top of your previous stitches until you get to the right side of the circle.
- 5



Quilt one more circle to complete this motif.
