Overlocker Woven Basket





Let's get crafty with Kraft-tex! This unique material is used to make a fun woven basket. Learn how to use overlock stitches to construct and embellish this quick and fun project. Any 4-thread overlock machine can make this project. The BERNINA L 860 was used for this sample.

SUPPLIES:

- 3/4 yd Kraft-tex any color, 18 1/2" -20" wide
- One spool of 12 wt cotton decorative thread (WonderFil Spagetti or Fruitti recommended)
- Two spools of coordinating regular thread (Isacord, Mettler Seracor, etc.)
- 90/14 ELX705 needle
- Rotary cutter and mat
- 20" rotary ruler
- WonderClips
- Thread snips
- Scissors
- Hot glue gun and glue
- Marking pencil
- Hera marker
- Roll and Press

MACHINE & ACCESSORIES:


- Standard Overlock Foot #L10
- Cording Foot #C17
- Right Seam Guide
- BERNINA L 860

Basket Construction

 Using the rotary cutter, cut 12 strips of Kraft-tex 2" x WOF (18 1/2" or 19" long, depending on your Kraft-tex piece).

NOTE: For this basket you will only use 11 strips. It's nice to have an extra...just in case. Use the leftovers for testing.

- Using the hera marker (or other scoring tool) and ruler, score lengthwise down the center of each strip.
- Fold each strip in half lengthwise along the score line, using the Roll and Press to make a sharp crease.



- Select the 3-Thread Wide Overlock stitch #3.
- Thread the machine with the 12 wt thread in the upper looper.
- Thread the left needle and lower looper with matching regular thread.
- Install the Right Seam Guide even with the blade so that the Kraft-tex is riding next to the blade but not being cut.







- Test the stitch on a folded piece of scrap Krafttex. Adjust as needed.
- These settings worked well for me, but you will want to test on your machine:

If using an L 860 or L 890, save the stitch in Personal Memory and call it "Kraft-tex".



Stitch the long raw edges together on all of the strips.




Mark the centers of eight strips on the wrong

- side (non-decorative thread side).
- Place four strips horizontally on the table in front of you with the decorative thread side facing down and all stitched ends facing in the same direction.



- Place one strip on either side of the center marks of the horizontal strips, right side down. Weave and glue to hold. Use a WonderClip to hold a moment until dry, if you like.
- Place one strip on either side of the first two and repeat. This is the base of your basket.



- Weave one strip all around the basket. Place the beginning end in the "under" position and glue in place. Add a clip to hold.
- Snug the strip down to the base. It may be helpful to use clips to hold together the tops of

the vertical strips. Trim any excess at the end of the woven strip and glue in place.

Repeat with two more strips.



- Weave the top ends of the vertical strips back down to the inside. Use glue to hold in place where you can't tuck in.
- Every other strip folds onto itself to the inside and tucks into the second row. Glue at the top to hold.



Serger Cord & Wire Ribbon Embellishments

Set the overlocker for a 3-Thread Rolled Hem stitch #8 with the decorative thread in the upper looper and matching regular thread in the right needle and lower looper.

- Stitch about three yards of serger cord, pulling slightly from the back.
- Use the serger cording as an embellishment. Add beads for extra bling.

TIP: A dental flosser works great to thread the cord through the beads.

- I preferred 26-gauge beading wire that I found at my local craft store.
- Use wire cutters, NOT your scissors to cut the wire
- Use Fray Block on the ends after cutting your ribbon tail
- Use the 2-Thread Rolled Hem #13 with WonderFil SoftLoc in the lower looper for best results
- Use the Cording Foot #L17. The guides keep the wire from interfering with the needle and knife.









- I also like batik fabrics for ribbon, since both sides are "right".
- For detailed instructions to make wire-edged ribbon, refer to weallsew.com and search for <u>DIY Wire-edged Ribbon</u>.



- Experiment with different sized bases and heights. This basket is a 4X4 with a three strip height. Other options are a 2X2 with a four strip height or a 2X5 with three strip height. You are only limited by the length of your strip of Krafttex.
- Try out different decorative threads and embellishments, too!
