



## Cutting list/Piece Count

Unfinished Size: 16 1/2" x 16 1/2"




FABRIC #	PIECE COUNT
1	<b>A</b> - (2) 2 ½" x 4 ½"
2	<b>B</b> - (4) 3 ½" x 4 ½"
3	C - (2) 4 ½" x 4 ½"
4	D - (4) 2 ½" x 4 ½"
5	FG 1 - (1) 9 ½" x 9 ½"
Background	<b>FG 2</b> - (4) 5" x 5"



### Flying Geese


Gather (1) 9 1/2" x 9 1/2" Fabric 5 FG 1 square and (4) 5" x 5" BG Fabric FG 2 squares.

Draw a diagonal line across the wrong side of the (4) smaller squares and use the instructions below to make 4-at-a-time FGs.



(1) 9 ½" x 9 ½" Fabric 5 FG 1 + (4) 5" x 5" BG Fabric FG 2

### **FLYING GEESE INSTRUCTIONS**




- 1. Place (2) smaller **BG Fabric FG 2** squares RST in opposite corners on the **Fabric 5 FG 1** square. The small squares will overlap in the center.
- 2. Sew a ¼" seam on both sides of the diagonal line.
- 3. Cut along the line and separate the unit into (2) parts.
- 4. Open and press seams toward the small triangles.
- 5. Place (2) more smaller squares RST on the (2) new units from previous step (diagram above only shows (1) unit).
- 6. Sew a 1/4" seam on both sides of the line.
- 7. Cut along the drawn line and separate into (2) parts.
- 8. Open and press toward the small triangles. Repeat steps 5-8 with all remaining FG pieces.
- 9. Trim all FG units to 8 ½" x 4 ½", using the video tutorial as a guide.




### **PIECING INSTRUCTIONS**


1. Sew (2) FGs RST as shown on the right and repeat to make (2)  $8\frac{1}{2}$ " x  $8\frac{1}{2}$ " flying geese units.




2. Gather all B rectangles and sew them RST to the top and bottom of each of the (2) A rectangles. Make (2) (2) 4 ½" x 8 ½" units.




3. Gather all **D** rectangles and sew them RST to the top and bottom of each of the (2) C squares. Make (2) 4 1/2" x 8 1/2" units.



4. From left to right, sew RST the units made in step 2, step 3, and step 1. Repeat to make (2) 16 ½" x 8 ½" units.



5. Rotate one of the units from the previous step by 180 degrees, and sew it RST to the top of the other unit made in the previous step to complete the 16 ½" x 16 ½" block. Reserve the block for guilt assembly instructions.
