

Hi There.

This block includes a Square-in-a-Square, which is exactly what it sounds like: one square framed by another. It's a classic, clean design that shows up in a lot of traditional quilt layouts, and it's a great skill-builder too. We'll be sewing on the bias here, which means the fabric edges can stretch more easily.



Background	FG 1 - (1) 7 ½" x 7 ½" SP 2 - (1) 3" x 25" B - (2) 3 ½" x 3 ½"

D - (8) 1 ½" x 6 ½"


Flying Geese


Gather (1) 7 ½" x 7 ½" **BG Fabric FG 1** square and (4) 4" x 4" **Fabric 2 FG 2** squares.

Draw a diagonal line across the wrong side of the (4) smaller squares and use the instructions below to make 4-at-a-time FGs.



FLYING GEESE INSTRUCTIONS





- 1. Place (2) smaller squares RST in opposite corners on its corresponding FG square. The small squares will overlap in the center.
- 2. Sew a 1/4" seam on both sides of the diagonal line.
- 3. Cut along the line and separate the unit into (2) parts.
- 4. Open and press seams toward the small triangles.
- 5. Place (2) more smaller squares RST on the (2) new units from previous step (diagram above only shows (1) unit).
- 6. Sew a 1/4" seam on both sides of the line.
- 7. Cut along the drawn line and separate into (2) parts.
- 8. Open and press toward the small triangles. Repeat steps 5-8 with all remaining FG pieces.
- 9. Trim all (4) FG units to 6 ½" x 3 ½".





PIECING INSTRUCTIONS


1. Gather (2) A squares and (2) B squares. Cut them in half diagonally to make a total of (4) Fabric 3 triangles and (4) BG Fabric triangles.



2. Fold each **Fabric 3** and **BG Fabric** triangle in half and press to make a crease. Fold **C** in half twice and press to make creases to show (4) equal quarters of the square.




- 3. Place (2) **Fabric 3** triangles RST to the top and bottom of **C**. Use the vertical crease of the square as a guide for centering the pieces, as the triangle bases will protrude past the edges of the **C** square. Sew a ¼" seam along both edges.
- 4. Press the new triangle pieces away from the square.
- 5. Place the remaining (2) **Fabric 3** triangles RST to the left and right side of the unit while using the horizontal crease of the square to help center the triangles along the edges. Sew a ¼" seam along both edges.
- 6. Press the new triangle pieces away from the square, and trim the dog ears away from the 4 ¾" x 4 ¾" unit.




7. Repeat steps 3-6 using the **BG Fabric** triangles and the 4 $\frac{3}{4}$ " x 4 $\frac{3}{4}$ " unit made in step 6. The square-in-asquare unit should measure 6 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 6 $\frac{1}{2}$ ".




8. Sew the **Fabric 1 SP 1** RST to the top of the **BG Fabric SP 2**. Press the seam towards the darker fabric, then make vertical cuts to the unit every 3" until (8) 3" x 5 ½" pieces are made.



9. Sew (2) of the units from step 8 RST to create a checkered unit, and repeat to make a total of (4) $5 \frac{1}{2}$ " x $5 \frac{1}{2}$ " checkered units.




10. Sew **D** RST to the top and bottom of each flying geese. Make (4) 6 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 5 $\frac{1}{2}$ " units. Press seams away from the FG.






11. Sew (2) of the units from step 10 RST to the left and right side of the square-in-a-square unit from step 7. Make (1) 16 ½" x 6 ½" unit, and press seams away from the square-in-a-square block.



12. With careful consideration of fabric orientation, sew (2) checkered units from step 9 RST to the left and right side of the (2) remaining flying geese units from step 10 to make (2) 16 ½" x 5 ½" units. Press seams away from the checkered units.



13. Sew the (2) units from step 13 RST to the top and bottom of the unit from step 11 to complete the $16 \frac{1}{2}$ " x $16 \frac{1}{2}$ " block. Reserve the block for quilt assembly instructions.
