






FABRIC #	PIECE COUNT
1	HST 1 - (1) 4" x 4"
2	HST 1 - (1) 4" x 4"
3	HST 1 - (1) 4" x 4"
4	HST 1 - (1) 4" x 4"
5	FG 2 - (4) 3" x 3" C - (4) 4 ½" x 2" D - (1) 4 ½" x 4 ½"
Background	HST 2 - (4) 4" x 4" FG 1 - (1) 5 ½" x 5 ½" A - (8) 3 ½" x 3 ½"


B - (4) 4 ½" x 3"

Half - Square Triangles


Gather all **HST 1** squares from Fabric **1**, **2**, **3**, and **4** and pair them each with (1) **BG Fabric HST 2** square. Draw a diagonal line across the wrong side of the lighter square from each pairing and use the instructions below to make 2-at-a-time HSTs.



HALF-SQUARE TRIANGLE INSTRUCTIONS



- 1. Place (1) pair of HST squares RST.
- 2. Sew a 1/4" seam on both sides of the diagonal line.
- 3. Cut along the line and separate the unit into (2) parts.
- 4. Open and press seams toward the darker fabric.
- 5. Trim all HSTs to 3 ½" x 3 ½".
- 6. Repeat steps 1-5 with the rest of the pairs to make:






Gather (1) 5 1/2" x 5 1/2" BG Fabric FG 1 square and (4) 3" x 3" Fabric 5 FG 2 squares.

Draw a diagonal line across the wrong side of the (4) smaller squares and use the instructions below to make 4-at-a-time FGs.



(1) 5 ½" x 5 ½" **BG Fabric FG 1** + (4) 3" x 3" **Fabric 5 FG 2**


FLYING GEESE INSTRUCTIONS




- 1. Place (2) smaller **Fabric 5 FG 2** squares RST in opposite corners on the **BG Fabric FG 1** square. The small squares will overlap in the center.
- 2. Sew a ¼" seam on both sides of the diagonal line.
- 3. Cut along the line and separate the unit into (2) parts.
- 4. Open and press seams toward the small triangles.
- 5. Place (2) more smaller squares RST on the (2) new units from previous step (diagram above only shows (1) unit).
- 6. Sew a 1/4" seam on both sides of the line.
- 7. Cut along the drawn line and separate into (2) parts.
- 8. Open and press toward the small triangles. Repeat steps 5-8 with all remaining FG pieces.
- 9. Trim all FG units to 4 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ ".

PIECING INSTRUCTIONS


1. Gather all **Fabric 1 HSTs** and sew them RST to the right side of (2) **A** squares to make (2) 6 ½" x 3 ½" units. Press seams toward the **A** squares.




Rotate one of the units from step 1 and sew it RST to the bottom of the other unit from step 1 to make
 6 ½" x 6 ½" unit with Fabric 1 HSTs. Press the new seam open.




3. Repeat steps 1 and 2 with all **Fabric 2, 3,** and **4 HSTs** and all remaining **A** squares to make (3) more 6 ½" x 6 ½" units.



4. Sew (1) flying geese RST to the bottom of **B**, then sew **C** RST to the top of the unit. Repeat to make a total of (4) 4 ½" x 6 ½" units.




5. Sew (2) of the units from step 4 RST to the left and right side of **D** to make (1) 16 ½" x 4 ½" unit. Press seams toward **D**.




PIECING INSTRUCTIONS


6. Sew the **Fabric 1 HST Unit** RST to the left side of one of the remaining units from step 4. Then, sew the **Fabric 2 HST Unit** RST to the right side of the unit to make (1) 16 ½" x 6 ½" unit. Press seams away from the middle unit.



7. Sew the **Fabric 3 HST Unit** RST to the left side of the last remaining unit from step 4. Then, sew the **Fabric 4 HST Unit** RST to the right side of the unit to make (1) 16 ½" x 6 ½" unit. Press seams away from the middle unit.



8. Sew the unit from step 6 RST to the top of the unit from step 5. Then, rotate the unit made in step 7 by 180 degrees and then sew it RST to the bottom of the unit to complete the 16 ½" x 16 ½" block. Reserve the block for quilt assembly instructions.
